

First founded in 1850, as California was achieving statehood, Santa Catalina School is an independent, all-girls, boarding and day school located on the Monterey Peninsula. Santa Catalina's mission is driven by four key values: excellence, spirituality, responsibility, and service.

Santa Catalina's curriculum draws inspiration from the classical tradition of the arts and sciences and our Catholic heritage, coupled with innovative classes to meet the demands of the 21st century. Our college-prep academics are complemented by rich offerings in the fine and performing arts and athletics. The school's 500-seat theater hosts three major dramatic productions each year, an array of concerts, and other programs, including our annual student-produced TEDx event. Catalina's athletic facilities field 20 athletic teams in which 70% of students participate. The Sister Claire and Sister Christine Mathematics and Science Center provides state-of-the-art facilities and is home to our unique Marine Ecology Research Program and our robotics team.

Honor Code

Violations of the Santa Catalina Honor Code, signed by all students at the beginning of each year, are reviewed by the Student-Faculty Discipline Committee. Santa Catalina notifies colleges to which any senior has applied of disciplinary action resulting in a suspension or permanent separation from the school. The school does not inform colleges of the reason for the disciplinary action. The student is responsible for contacting college admission offices within two weeks of the discipline decision to explain the circumstances leading to her change in status.

Journey Program

Journey, Santa Catalina's signature co-curricular program, encompasses a weekly advising session as well as triannual Journey Days, which offer deeper "dives" into topics of community interest through presentations by visiting speakers, films, and discussion groups. Journey ensures a smooth transition into Santa Catalina for new students, teaches students essential life skills, promotes their growth as leaders, and helps them to seek the best possible fit in the college application process.

Grade Point Average

Santa Catalina School does not rank students. GPA calculations are cumulative on a 4.0 scale. Weighting is .5 for Honors, AP, and AT courses. Students may not take an Honors, AP, or AT course without approval from the Assistant Head of Upper School. The school year is divided into two semesters.

*Marine Ecology Research Program (MERP)

MERP is a three-year intensive, accelerated study of the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary's marine environment. Each student develops and pursues a research project, working with instructors and local marine agencies (e.g. Stanford's Hopkins Marine Station). The program culminates with the presentation of the student's research findings at a public, scientific forum (e.g. the Western Society of Naturalists Annual Meeting).
