This is a unique opportunity to join students and teachers who joyfully and actively engage together in creating values-based, intentional community. The Lower and Middle School Art Teacher will join a highly collaborative and dedicated faculty who are committed to strengthening and enriching learning through innovative teaching methods that enable students to identify and solve problems, bridge content across traditional "subject" domains, and develop an unshakable growth mindset.

Description

Our Lower and Middle School art program, located in a state-of-the-art studio space, provides all students multiple opportunities to enjoy learning to create art, to appreciate various forms of artistic expression, and to demonstrate their creativity in a variety of settings with confidence. The art teacher is deft at establishing positive relationships with students, their families, and colleagues; accomplishes grade-appropriate curriculum planning and instruction; and is a role model for innovation, creativity, and integration between disciplines. Reporting to the Head of Lower and Middle School, the art teacher will join with colleagues who work closely together and value collegiality.

Essential Responsibilities

- Teach visual art to all students in grades 1-8 as part of the Lower and Middle School curriculum
- Apply knowledge of child development to teaching and classroom management
- Understand and employ developmentally appropriate pedagogical approaches and varied presentation styles to ensure high student engagement
- Actively employ various project outcomes and assessment methods in order to more fully address different learning needs
- Create a classroom environment centered on problem-solving, synthesizing information, and integrating knowledge
- Communicate clearly in writing and verbally to students, other teachers, parents, and administrators regarding student progress and student needs
- Maintain accurate and complete records of student progress and development to adjust teaching strategies
- Pursue professional development to maintain expertise in performance of teaching responsibilities and promote the sharing of best practices with other members of the school's faculty community
- Show genuine concern for students: demonstrate deep investment in student learning and success both in and out of the classroom
- Manage student behavior in and out of the classroom by establishing and enforcing rules and procedures
- Participate and support the life of the school through various duties as assigned
- Attend and engage in department, school, and parent meetings

Qualifications

- A bachelor's degree in related field required, master's degree and/or teaching credential preferred
- Two or more years of experience as a primary grade and/or middle school art teacher
- A commitment to the mission and identity of Santa Catalina School
- A desire to participate fully in the Santa Catalina community
- Successful completion of a LiveScan criminal background check as required by law
